Contributions and information requests are to be sent to kiane.goudarzi@univ-lyon3.fr and marco.heimann@univ-lyon3.fr with "publishing workshop JBE" as the object of the mail. Authors should specify the section of JBE to which they want to submit and respect JBE format guidelines.

Papers will be selected based on the potential value of their contribution as well as on the respective expertise of section editors involved. Being accepted to the workshop does not guarantee any acceptance of the paper in the journal. Yet, to be eligible for the Workshop, the abstract / paper should have been accepted for presentation in a major conference in the field (to be specified in the submission mail).

Authors have to participate intensively before and during the conference: Before the conference, they review the papers of other participants (2 maximum) and modify their own article (based on preliminary feedbacks received mid-November from the editor and other authors). During the workshop they present major contributions and modifications made on their own papers and give formalized suggestions on the second version of the article of others' papers. The organization committee manages authors, editor's interactions with authors, and copy editing options. The copy editing is handled by Elsevier Services, and can be used before or after the workshop.
